



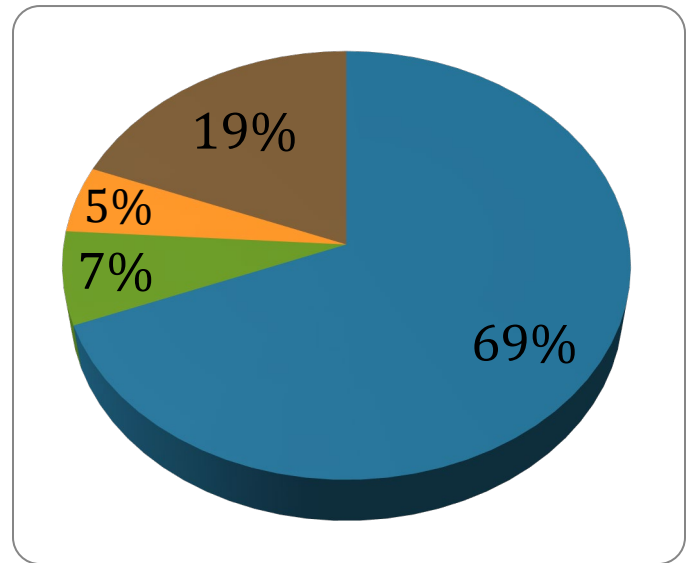
Financial Report – Fiscal Year 2022-23
